## 25,000 seats in RTE are vacant

Under the Right to Education Act (RTE), the admission process for 25 per cent reserved seats in private schools in the state is slow and more than 25,000 seats are vacant. The second round will now be implemented for the students on the waiting list. The entire admission process will be completed by October 25, according to the school education department.

Out of which admission of 68 thousand 952 students was completed. It was decided to admit the children on the waiting list after giving them ample opportunity by extending

# Make Plan B for Competitive Exam

Government jobs were never the answer. As the country develops in the future, government opportunities will decrease. So 'prepare for the competitive exams by breaking the life; But since only 0.1 per cent will be successful, without fail, make it a 'Plan A' for the opportunities in other jobs, business, agribusiness, service sector, etc. and keep 'Plan B' for the competitive examination.

After passing the written test conducted by the Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC), a young man committed suicide due to a long delay in getting an interview. It was a really unfortunate incident. It remains to be seen why this situation arose. Due to the growing population, the number of graduates every year, the number of unemployed is increasing due to the lack of employment opportunities. Moreover, since agriculture is not profitable, it is imperative for rural youth to choose a job. However, can government jobs be the answer to unemployment? Although the statistics of the country and the states are not compiled in a scientific manner, according to the Sample Survey, 94 per cent of the total employment in the country is in the unorganized sector. Of the six per cent employment in the organized sector, only three-and-a-half per cent employment is available in the governance system from the Gram Panchayat to the Central Government. Measures to increase employment in the business, private sector include expansion of industry,



development of IT and other service sectors to increase opportunities; As such, it is not about government jobs.

The posts there are not just to increase employment opportunities. In fact, there is a tendency to reduce government jobs to make more money available for capital expenditure by reducing the tax burden on the public. So government jobs were never the solution for employment. As the country develops in the future, government employment opportunities will decrease.

• The need for awareness

So the first point is that if the country wants to keep the unemployment rate low, there is scope for increasing opportunities in the unorganized sector, agriculture, business, micro-small-medium-large scale industries, service sector; Similarly, since 97% of the opportunities for finding employment are in the non-government sector, it is necessary to pay attention to it as a matter of priority. There are very few senior posts ('Class-1 / A' or 'Class-2 / B') filled by the Central or State Public Service Commission through competitive examinations. Therefore, there is fierce competition at the national and state levels for very few posts. Given the number

of vacancies available and the number of aspiring candidates, it could unfortunately be fatal. In the All India Services like 'IAS', 'IPS' etc., about one thousand officers are selected every year by the Central Public Service Commission (UPSC); But there are ten to eleven lakh applicants for it. There are more than three and a half lakh applications for 400 to 450 posts in the main state service examination of MPSC. Out of this, only 0.1 per cent of the applicants get jobs.

Against this backdrop, there should be awareness among the youth. 'Study hard for competitive exams, strive day and night to succeed; But only 0.1 per cent of the candidates will ultimately succeed. Therefore, in order to prevent failure, candidates should be told to make 'Plan A' and 'Plan B' of competitive examination for opportunities in other jobs, business, agribusiness, service supply sector etc. Inefficiency and sensitivity are the blood-soaked and highly despised components of the administrative system. It is reasonable to expect that the posts in the Central and State Governments will never be vacant. A large number of these posts in the state remain vacant or retained for years; In fact, the matter is considered secondary

in the administration. In fact, what is the reality of the matter on which a huge amount is spent, if it is brought to the notice of the Legislature every year by each department and especially the General Administration Department through budget or program budget, then that fact will come before the state.

• Why are there vacancies?

Top three reasons for vacancies. The first is the indifference of the secretaries of the concerned departments to the issue of filling the vacancies. Secondly, the decision of the government to ban recruitment on the initiative of the finance department by showing the income of the state and taking a huge plan and then showing the deficit in the income. The third issue is that officers or employees should not be recruited; this is because of the fact that by reducing the number of working officers, one person can have additional geographical or administrative responsibilities. While this part is exceptional, it is, unfortunately, a democracy.

The posts should never be left vacant and the administration should once again adopt a culture of continuing opportunities for job seekers and it is not impossible. Just as there are manpower departments in real private companies, there is a general administration department at the state government level (which is very important to the chief minister) and each department or office has a separate branch and branch head for 'administration'. Therefore, the bureaucracy has been created so that the posts do

not remain vacant. As per the policy of the government, all the departments will review their departments in September every year and the posts will become vacant in the next calendar year.

This policy is not being implemented only due to the stagnant administrative system and the extreme inaction of the department secretaries. As the selection process takes time, the process may start a year or two in advance. All MLAs in the state are accountable to their voters. He should insist that the government should start the practice of keeping information on the table on the first day of the assembly session and keeping 'performance reports' on the secretaries who fall short. This can be the solution.

Job seekers do not end there. No matter the delay, those candidates need to be appointed within a month or two after the commission sends the list of successful candidates to the government; But even there, these candidates do not get appointments for months or even years. The secretaries of all the departments are responsible for this delay. They are expected to be controlled by the Chief Secretary. That doesn't happen. With few exceptions, the administrative leadership is responsible for delays in filling administrative posts; And then the political leadership has to take notice as the public outcry grows. For this, it is essential to repair this administrative system.

**• 1 Lakh Schools In India Run With Just 1 Teacher Each: Unesco Report**

The country's future is taking shape in school classrooms, the Kothari Commission said, adding that it has been more than fifty years now. Then three or four generations dropped out of school. In five decades a lot has changed, the scope of education has expanded, the number of schools has skyrocketed, the number of students has also increased; But in some cases there is no difference between then and now.

The Kothari Commission's recommendation that six per cent of gross domestic product (GDP) should be spent on education (actually investment) is still on paper today. On the contrary, there is a shortage of educational facilities, infrastructure and teachers in schools due to declining expenditure. The report released this year by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) on the state of education in the country sheds light on this and cannot be ignored by policy makers. The title of the report, 'No Teacher, No Class', is sufficient to comment on the state of education and teachers in the country.

Out of 15.51 lakh schools



in the country, 1.10 lakh schools have single teachers and 11.16 lakh posts of teachers are vacant. Out of the one-teacher schools, 89 per cent schools and 69 per cent teacher vacancies are in rural areas. This statistic points to the widening of the urban-rural divide in education.

In fact, these figures and conclusions do not require a UNESCO report; Because that's the fact. From domestic surveys; It also appears in various ways in government reports. UNESCO has also relied on government figures for this report. Even so, owning one is still beyond the reach of the average person. Therefore, it is necessary to discuss this on the occasion of such reports.

The student is the center of learning; But the teachers are shaping it. Therefore, the teacher

has a unique place in the education system. There are two extremes in society about teachers. On the one hand, he is worshiped as a 'Guru', on the other hand, he is despised in a tone of contempt. Teaching is a difficult subject, for which vocational training is important,



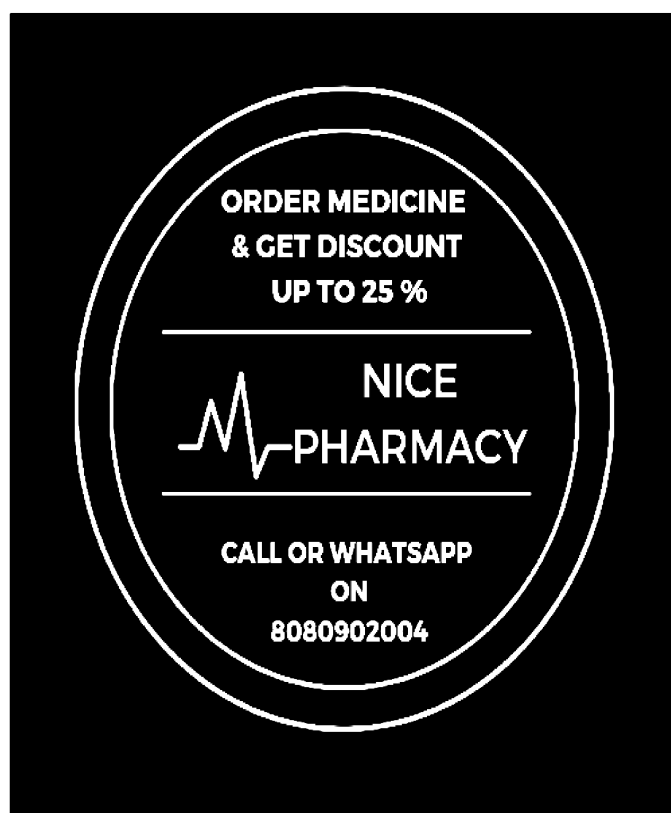
a fact that society forgets. There are many misconceptions about the work of teachers and the leave they get. On the other hand, the government is constantly harassing teachers for some non-academic work. There is a need to increase investment in schools and facilities to reach quality education to children from all

walks of life; The couple needs to provide quality training to teachers, giving them freedom at work. The recommendations of UNESCO are similar. The term 'frontline worker' was coined for those working with Corona on the front lines. UNESCO's recommendation that teachers should also be given the status of 'frontline workers' is important; But not only this, with the help of fire you can do welding. There is a need to fill the vacancies of teachers, to make one-teacher schools two-teacher, to give priority to teacher training. The current practice of burdening teachers with other non-academic work needs to be stopped. Although there have been occasional announcements of its closure, in reality it has continued. Most of the teacher vacancies are in Uttar Pradesh.

There are 3.3 lakh vacancies. It is followed by Bihar (2.2 lakh) and West Bengal (1.1 lakh). In Maharashtra too, there are 74,445 vacancies, which is 14 per cent of the total teachers. The growing number of single-teacher schools and teacher vacancies in rural areas is worrisome. While it is true that equality is achieved through education, in reality the opportunity for education is not equally available everywhere. There is a big difference between urban and rural areas in terms of schools, educational facilities, number of teachers and other supplementary facilities. Even in the cities, the upper class schools are different and the poor are different. There is a need to stop this kind of inequality from education as well. This inequality has been increasing in the last three decades since the adoption of the policy of liberalization. It is true that the scope of education expanded during this period; But it is not enough, according to various reports. A recent UNESCO report underscores this point. There is no action by the government to eliminate inequality. The new national education policy has also kept quiet about spending on education. Considering that there can be no schools without teachers, the solution is to increase investment in education.

## MHT-CET 2021: Only 80% attendance at MHT CET

The CET exam was conducted in the last week of September by the State Common Entrance Examination Cell (CET Cell). About 80% of the students have appeared for this entrance test. Students who could not appear for the exams due to floods will now be given a chance on October 9 and 10.



About 80 per cent students have appeared for the entrance exams for engineering and technology, pharmacology and agriculture courses. The entrance test was held from September 20 to October 1. Two lakh 30 thousand 655 lakh students were registered from PCM (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics)

group. Out of which 40 thousand 232 thousand students were absent; While one lakh 90 thousand 423 students appeared for the exam, the attendance rate was 62.56 percent. Two lakh 76 thousand 841 were registered from PCB (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) group. Of these, 57 thousand 344 thousand students were absent; Two lakh 19 thousand 497 students gave CET which is 79.29 percent. The examination was conducted by the State Common Entrance Examination Cell (CET Cell) in the last week of September. Five lakh 7 thousand students were registered from both the groups. All of these students were scheduled online and the exam was taken online. The PSM group exam was held in 10 sessions. Examinations conducted in different sessions were conducted smoothly.

The results of these examinations will be announced by October 20 and the academic year 2021-22 will start from November. Students who could not appear for the exams due to floods will now be given a chance on October 9 and 10.
